I. DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT AND METHODOLOGY

The survey of architectural resources within the National Register Middleburg Historic District was undertaken during the winter of 1999 and the spring of 2000. Its purpose was to investigate and document approximately 150 architectural properties in an area defined as the Middleburg Historic District (Map 1) in order to consolidate and update previous survey information. The project was funded as a Certified Local Government grant between the Town of Middleburg and the Virginia Department of Historic Resources (CLG Project HDRC 99-01). Proposals were solicited and Maral S. Kalbian, Architectural Historian, was chosen as the consultant to carry out the work.

Ms. Kalbian, an architectural historian/preservation consultant based in Boyce, Virginia, managed the project, conducted the field work, entered the survey data into the IPS program, wrote the Executive Summary report, and conducted all the public meetings. Survey assistants included Ann Finch and Leila Boyer.

The main objectives of the project were to update the survey information that had been conducted in 1977. A National Register Nomination had been written in 1981 using that earlier survey information, but no other work had been done since then. The project involved the consolidation and updating of previous survey information from the 1977 survey of the 1787 section of Middleburg and the 1981 survey of the property known as The Hill. Modern photographs were taken and up to date architectural descriptions and evaluations were entered into the IPS (Integrated Preservation Software) database. A historic context has already been written for the district in the 1981 National Register nomination. This document, which gives an overview of the architectural resources as well as recommendations for further work, will hopefully serve as a planning tool for making land-use decisions, planning for future survey, and evaluation and treatment of architectural resources within the town.

The survey products include the following:

1. Two MS-Dos compatible diskettes (one to DHR and one to the Town of Middleburg) containing the survey data using the Integrated Preservation Software (IPS).

2. Two sets of 155 IPS-generated Reconnaissance-level architectural survey forms, and one Intensive-level architectural survey form with accompanying photographs and maps (one to DHR and one to the Town of Middleburg).

3. Eight bound copies of the Executive Summary Report (six copies to DHR and two to the Town of Middleburg).

4. Two computer diskettes containing the executive summary (one to DHR and one to the Town of Middleburg).

5. One set of photographic negatives.

6.Two sets of Town of Middleburg Base Maps (one for DHR and one for Middleburg) with surveyed properties labeled.

7. Two sets of color slides showing representative building types, representative examples of building styles and representative streetscapes (one set to DHR and one to Middleburg).

The architectural fieldwork for the project was initiated with a windshield survey of the Town of Middleburg on November 12, 1999, with Scott Brooks-Miller, DHR project contact, and Martha Mason Semmes, Middleburg Town Planner. The purpose was to better define the boundaries of the proposed survey area and identify which noncontributing resources were not to be surveyed. On December 10, 1999, the contract was amended to conduct an intensive survey on only one property in Middleburg (The Hill), instead of the previously contracted five. It was agreed that this would compensate for the time it would take the consultant to create 140 additional IPS forms, which were to have been provided by the DHR.

A Public Information Meeting was held on Thursday, December 2, 1999, at the Middleburg Town Office to inform the public about the project and the upcoming fieldwork. All the architectural resources within the area defined by the consultant, the Town Planner, and DHR were photographed, mapped and recorded using DHR IPS Reconnaissance-level survey forms according to DHR standards. Fieldwork began on December 31, 1999, when the intensive survey of The Hill was completed. The reconnaissance-survey was conducted during the month of February.

New DHR file numbers were assigned to each property. The district number is 259-162. Three properties were surveyed that are outside the National Register District but inside the Local Historic District. These were assigned Middleburg file numbers not district file numbers (Map 2). A total of 155 properties were surveyed, 27 of which were considered noncontributing. The survey area covered approximately 110 acres.

The closeout date for this project, including the final submission of this report and the public presentation of a slide show, is June 30, 2000.

The Historical and Architectural Overviews in this executive summary come primarily from the Middleburg Comprehensive Plan prepared by staff, and the Middleburg Historic District National Register Nomination Form prepared by the Department of Historic Resources staff (then known as Virginia Historic Landmarks Commission, Robert A. Carter and David Edwards, authors) in December 1981. The National Register Nomination provides a detailed architectural and historical analysis of the district. This executive report is meant simply as a summary. Included in the historical and architectural overview chapters are a series of frequency and summary reports that were run using the IPS database. These provide a better understanding of the types and dates of historic resources currently found in the Middleburg Historic District and better place the buildings in their context. II. HISTORICAL OVERVIEW

The Town of Middleburg is located in southwestern Loudoun County, just north of the Fauquier-Loudoun county line and fourteen miles east of the Blue Ridge Mountains. The town, with a 1999 population of approximately 650 persons, is situated at the intersection of U.S. Route 50, Route 626 north, and Route 776 south. Route 50 extends east-west through the town, forming the town's main axis, Washington Street. Routes 626 north and 776 south form Madison Street, the town's major north-south axis. Middleburg is the main commercial center for a primarily rural area of Loudoun County, and is surrounded by well-tended farms that support the agricultural and horse breeding interests of many area residents.

Middleburg was originally part of a 3,300-acre patent that Rawleigh Chinn received from the Northern Neck Proprietary in 1731. In 1763, Joseph Chinn, Rawleigh's son, sold a 500acre parcel of that land (that included present day Middleburg) to Leven Powell. The area was then known as "Chinn's Crossroads." Middleburg was originally laid out in 1787 in seventy half-acre lots arranged in a grid pattern. The streets were named after prominent friends of the Constitution and management of the town was placed in the hands of seven trustees. Powell himself regulated the settlement of the town lots, requiring each owner to build a dwelling at least sixteen feet square with a masonry chimney within one year of date of purchase, a common provision in town deeds of the day. The major part of Middleburg is still contained within the original town boundaries.

Middleburg was so named because of its location mid-way between Alexandria and Winchester along the major Ashby's Gap Turnpike. It first developed as a convenient coach stop and relay station. However, when Powell died in 1810, only seventeen of the seventy lots had been sold. After the War of 1812, Powell's son, Burr, took over his father's plans for Middleburg and actively sought further development of the town. In 1816, he officially recorded the Town Plat at the County Courthouse and appointed five new trustees. The Fund for Internal Improvement and the Board of Public Works was established by the General Assembly around the same time, and led to the substantial improvement of transportation systems throughout the state. This greatly helped Middleburg, which was located along a major transportation route linking the port of Alexandria to the Shenandoah Valley and points west. By 1835, the town had seventy dwellings, seven mercantile stores, two churches, four academies, two hotels, two attorneys, four physicians, and twenty businesses supporting a population of 430 persons. In addition, eighteen flourmills existed within a ten-mile radius of town further spurred the town's growth.

By the mid-nineteenth century, Middleburg had developed into an important commercial and institutional center for lower Loudoun and upper Fauquier counties. The construction of the B & O Railroad line from Baltimore to Winchester was completed in the 1830s. Despite this development, which diverted much of the Valley wagon traffic away from Middleburg, the town continued to flourish, in a large part due to the expanding market for local wheat and flour. In 1853, the town's population had increased to 600, and commercial and residential buildings were clustered along four blocks of Washington Middleburg Executive Summary Report Maral S. Street between Jay and Pendleton and the two blocks of Madison between Marshall and Federal. Industrial establishments, such as a cabinet factory, were located at the edge of town, while hotels and stores were located at the center of town.

At the outbreak of the Civil War, Middleburg was staunchly pro-slavery and in favor of secession. This was due in a large part to the economic dependence of many surrounding plantations on slave labor. During the War, Middleburg became part of "Mosby's Confederacy," the area of Fauquier, Loudoun, and Clarke counties where Lt. Col. John Singleton Mosby and his rangers conducted many of their raids against Federal troops. Mosby realized the strategic location of Middleburg along the Turnpike between U. S. Troops in Northern Virginia and the Valley, and often operated in its vicinity. In retaliation for its support of Mosby, Union troops occupied the town in 1862 and periodically raided it for horses, supplies, and even hostages. Between June 17 and June 21, 1863, several severe cavalry battles were fought near Middleburg. After the Battle of the Wilderness in 1864, more than 1,200 Confederate casualties were cared for in Middleburg homes and churches that were converted into hospitals.

In 1865, the U. S. War Department set up a Freedman's Bureau in Middleburg, to assist the newly emancipated black population with jobs, homes, and education in their adjustment to a free life. Blacks continued to contribute to Middleburg after the War, holding a wide variety of jobs including schoolteachers, nurses, ministers, blacksmith, and builders. The area around the intersection of N. Jay and E. Marshall streets has several buildings associated with the post-Civil War African-American community of Middleburg. In1872, Middleburg was officially incorporated by an Act of the General Assembly. Several churches were built, and several academies were established within the decade following the end of the war. Nonetheless, Middleburg stopped growing by the late 1870s and entered a period of decline, which continued into the twentieth century. According to census records, Middleburg's population steadily declined during the last decades of the nineteenth century: from 419 in 1880, to 296 in 1900, down to 263 in 1910.

The advent of the Piedmont and Orange Hunts in 1904 helped to jump start Middleburg back into a period of prosperity. The Hunts were founded by a New Yorker named Harry Worcester Smith and several of his New York friends, who also leased the Colonial Inn (old Noble Beveridge House) in Middleburg as a clubhouse. Local interest in foxhunting and horseracing culminated in the organization of the Middleburg Hunt in 1906 and continued with the settlement of well-known equestrians to the area in and around Middleburg. This type of activity attracted investment capital to the area and resulted in a renewed interest in new construction and the preservation of historic buildings. The town, whose population once again began to increase in the late 1920s, succeeded in becoming a seat of international reputation for the breeding, showing, and racing of thoroughbred horses.

Middleburg has continued to grow and prosper since then, while still maintaining a small town ambiance. In 1932, the Glenwood Race Course was laid out north of town by sportsman Daniel C. Sands, and placed the Middleburg Races among the premier steeplechase meetings in the world. The weekly publication of *The Chronicle of the Horse*,

headquartered in Middleburg, further validates the town's reputation as the center of the hunt country. The frequent weekend visits of President John F. Kennedy and his family in the early 1960s brought even greater public prominence to the town. More recently, the opening of The National Sporting Library, home of one of the world's most extraordinary collection of books on turf and field sports, has brought even more distinction to Middleburg.

Results of a frequency report run for the field of Historic Context show that the approximately 60% of the resources in Middleburg are dwellings under the theme of Domestic. The next most common type of buildings in the district are commercial ones (30%). In addition, Middleburg contains one school, five churches, and two community centers.

A frequency report run for the field Year Built reveals that out of 155 resources, seventeen buildings were constructed in the eighteenth century: the earliest with a known date of 1780, and ten with a date of ca. 1800. Twenty-three buildings date to the period of 1801 to 1850, while only two from the period 1851-1899. Sixteen buildings were assigned the date ca. 1900, with an additional thirty-three constructed between then and 1929. Twenty resources were documented from the period of 1930-1950. Only twenty-seven buildings constructed since 1950 were surveyed: there are many others considered noncontributing that were not documented. In summary, it appears that Middleburg has the greatest number of surviving buildings that date to the first half of the twentieth century, with the next most common historic time period being ca. 1800 to 1850.

The following report lists the properties within the district in chronological order with the earliest buildings listed first.

III. ARCHITECTURAL OVERVIEW

The major part of Middleburg is still contained within the original boundaries of the town as it was laid out in 1787 with a few additional tracts appended to the north, south, and west. Substantial residential development has occurred at the western end of the town beginning in the mid-twentieth century and is continuing today. Commercial property south of Federal Street was also developed beginning in the early twentieth century.

The original town plan called for the two main streets (Washington and Madison streets) to be sixty feet wide, whereas the other streets were to be forty feet wide. All the existing Streets in the district are paved. Sidewalks, some of old brick, extend along both sides of Washington and Madison streets. A number of mature trees shade the streets in the district.

Building density increases toward the center of town, which is at the intersection of Washington and Madison streets. The major commercial district is centered along Washington and Madison Streets, although many residences along Federal Street have also been converted into commercial use. Almost all the buildings are uniformly set back from the street, thereby creating a regulated facade line. The lots are larger at the eastern and western ends of town, and the residences in these areas are located further back from the street. The two churches on Washington Street are also located further back from the street than the surrounding building. These open spaces are enclosed by iron fences and add to the visual character of the Middleburg streetscape.

Although the town was established in 1787, there are only a few eighteenth-century structures existing within the town limits. The Red Fox Inn is generally considered the oldest building in Middleburg, but a recent National Register Nomination of the property indicates that, although the building may incorporate an earlier eighteenth-century stone tavern, it is primarily an 1820s Federal-style building.

The Shades (259-162-26), constructed ca. 1780 as a slave quarter's for a much larger property that was the home of Middleburg founder Leven Powell, appears to be the oldest building in Middleburg. It is a two-story, gable-roofed stone structure that has undergone a fair amount of remodeling. The other early buildings in the district are generally small, vernacular ones, either log or stone construction, and have been covered in stucco or other siding. They often make up the core of a larger building, as may be the case with the Red Fox Inn.

The Middleburg Historic District contains a fine collection of early- to mid-nineteenthcentury, Federal-style buildings, mostly located along Washington and Madison streets. These two-story structures are generally of brick construction with interior-end brick chimneys and Federal-style details including brick jack arches above the openings, nineover-six and six-over-six double-hung windows, molded and mouse tooth brick cornices, brick water tables, and graceful fanlights and transoms over entrances. The predominant floor plan is the central-passage with a three or five-bay façade. Other buildings have sidepassage plans with flanking additions dating to the mid-nineteenth century. Often these later additions are Greek Revival-style in nature and feature parapeted gable ends. Most of Middleburg Executive Summary Report Maral S. Kalbian, 2000 Page 11 of 28

these Federal-style dwellings are still used as residences, although a fair number, especially the ones closer to the intersection of Madison and Washington streets, have been converted into commercial uses. During the survey, nineteen resources were identified as being examples of the Federal Style, some of the finest are The Hill, Vine Hill, Windsor House, and the Luck House.

During the second quarter of the nineteenth century, four churches were built within the Middleburg Historic District. The oldest of these is Asbury Methodist Church on N. Jay Street. Erected in 1829, the two-story, stuccoed building features semicircular-headed front windows and a gable-end orientation. It has been owned by a black congregation since 1864. Emmanuel Episcopal Church, the district's best example of the Gothic Revival style, was constructed in 1843. The one-story brick building features a stepped-parapeted façade and pointed-arch windows. Middleburg Baptist Church was constructed in 1847 and is located at the southeast edge of town. Also of brick construction, the simple two-story, gable-end, church features a Flemish-bond façade and two front entrances. The Middleburg Methodist Church was begun in 1858 and completed after the Civil War. Its round-arched windows make reference to the Romanesque Revival style. The most recent church in Middleburg is Shiloh Baptist Church, built in 1913, in the vernacular Gothic Revival Style.

The poor economic conditions in Middleburg after the Civil War and into the early twentieth century, allowed for very little new construction during that period. As a result, there are only a few late-nineteenth-century structures within the Middleburg Historic District. Most of these are small, vernacular commercial buildings located along Federal Street. It was not until the early twentieth century, particularly the second decade of the 1900s that economic prosperity returned to Middleburg, and new buildings were once again constructed.

Most of the architecture of the early twentieth century along Washington Street is commercial or institutional in nature. These include gas stations, retail establishments, car dealerships, banks, community centers, and post offices. The predominant architectural style of the first half of the twentieth century is the Colonial- or Georgian-Revival Style. Some of the more notable buildings of this period include the former bank building on the corner of Washington and Madison Streets (1924), the Shaggy Ram (1930), and The Middleburg Community Center (1949). This style continued to be used into the second half of the twentieth century as is exemplified in the U.S. Post Office (1960), and The Middleburg National Bank (1958). Most of these buildings are thoughtfully designed to blend with the older architecture by using similar scale, massing, and proportion. There are some modern buildings in the district, however, that are not as sympathetic to the existing architecture and interrupt the rhythm of the streetscape, including Middleburg Safeway and Middleburg Exxon.

The largest concentration of residential architecture from the early to mid-twentieth century is located in the northwestern section of the historic district, an area that was rapidly developed in the second quarter of the twentieth century. Most of these are frame, stucco, or stone bungalows built in the 1920s and 30s. Some larger, more impressive houses from

this period were also built along Washington Street, including several Dutch Colonial-style dwellings.

Residential construction has continued in Middleburg up to the present day. A large group of townhouses (not included in the survey) have been constructed in the east and north ends of town in recent decades. These generally conform to the existing architecture.

In summary, the Middleburg Historic District contains an impressive collection of historic structures beginning with the earliest buildings from the late eighteenth century. The district contains a wide variety of architectural styles and building types, highlighted by early brick and stone structures. The frequency report below lists the number of different types of buildings types identified in the district.

IV. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR FURTHER STUDY

Based on the survey and evaluation of 155 properties in the Middleburg Historic District, Maral S. Kalbian recommends that the following actions be taken in planning for future survey work and the stewardship of the historic resources already identified.

Potentially Eligible Properties:

The Middleburg National Register Historic District was completed in 1981. The document, completed by DHR staff, is very well written and provides a lot of historical background and architectural assessment of the town's rich architectural heritage. Since that time, only one property in the Middleburg Historic District (The Red Fox Inn) has been individually listed on the National Register. Much Haddam (259-164) located just west of the Historic District boundary, but still in Middleburg, is also individually listed on the National Register. Individual listing within a listed National Historic District will provide more in depth information about a specific historic building. The following properties should be investigated further in order to determine their possible individual listing to the Virginia Landmarks Register and/or National Register of Historic Places:

Further Architectural Survey:

• Currently, the Middleburg Historic District includes only the original Levin Powell 1787 section of Middleburg. The are other areas outside of this section that are worthy of study and preservation, especially the north and west ends of town. Fieldwork should be conducted to gain a comprehensive knowledge of all historic resources within that area.

This may possibly lead to the expansion of both the Middleburg National Register District and the Local Historic District boundaries.

• Middleburg appears to have a rich African-American History. It had its own Freedman's Bureau office in the 1860s. A group of buildings relating to Black History are concentrated in the northeastern part of the district (near the intersection of N. Jay and E. Marshall streets). These should be examined in greater detail and more historical research should be conducted on this subject in order to understand fully its significance.

• In addition, intensive survey work should be conducted on the sixteen properties that may be potentially eligible for the register.

Archaeological Survey:

The scope of this project and of all previous surveys did not allow for archaeological investigations. It is recommended that a comprehensive archaeological assessment to determine potential survey needs be conducted. If it is determined that there is a potential for unidentified archaeological resources within Middleburg, then an archeological survey should be undertaken.

Preservation Policies:

Middleburg is fortunate in that most of its buildings are currently well maintained. The Middleburg Planning Department should actively pursue the following in order to ensure that good stewardship of the resources within the district continues.

• Encourage and assist property owners to pursue State and National Register designation on an individual basis.

• Encourage and assist property owners to voluntarily place preservation easements on their historic buildings and provide them with information about the financial benefits of doing so.

• Conduct a survey of the public and private cemeteries and burial grounds within Middleburg.

• Promote community awareness and public education by developing video presentations, seminars, slide lectures, and written information regarding tax incentives, designation procedures, design guidelines, and appropriate rehabilitation guidelines.

• In order to promote heritage tourism in the Town, develop self-guided walking and driving tours highlighting the architecture and history of Middleburg.

• Develop a local historic plaque program that would bring attention to particularly significant buildings and sites.

• Use the IPS database to identify specific design elements that are commonly found in the historic buildings in Middleburg and incorporate them into the existing design guidelines.

• Actively pursue more Certified Local Government (CLG) grants to help fund many of these projects.
