  - 1-5, no to adequate to well defined
- 5. How much community involvement does the application outline, both up to this point and during the project work?
  - 1-5, none to adequate to extensive community involvement
- 6. Does the application address if the proposed project will mitigate a specific threat to the historic resource?
  - 1-5, no threat to clear and eminent threat
- 7. Based on the presented application, does the project appear to be shovel-ready?
  - 1-5, no to somewhat to fully shovel ready
- 8. Does the application make clear the overall merits of the proposed project?
  - 1-5, no to somewhat to well defined merit
- 9. Based on the application, do you believe that this applicant has financial need?
  - Yes- 2 points
  - No- 0 points
- 10. Based on the application, does this project appear to support public investment and interest through (1 point each):
  - Education
  - Recreation
  - Research
  - Heritage tourism
  - Community development
